

Registration Fee

All international students are required to pay a registration fee of \$300.

Acceptance Fee

All international students are required to pay an acceptance fee of \$1000. This fee is non-refundable and is used to cover the cost of the student's acceptance letter and other administrative costs.

Semester Fees

Non-tuition fees are 50% of the tuition fees. These fees include the cost of the student's student ID card, health insurance, and other administrative costs. For the first semester, the total fee is \$1000. For the second semester, the total fee is \$1000.

The allowance is paid in four installments of 15%, 25%, 30%, and 30% respectively. The allowance is subject to the provisions of the Family Allowance Act (R.S. 19:3(V)).
